Safe Boating Through Education

From The Commander Cdr Harl Porter, SN



y name is Harl Porter, and on 21 November 2009 I was sworn in as Commander of the Charleston Sail and Power Squadron. My wife Betsy was there at the Change of Watch and will help and support my efforts as your Commander. I also need your help and support.

BRIDGE is defined by *Nautical Know How* as the location from which a vessel is steered and its speed controlled. Collectively your elected officers are known as the Charleston Sail and Power Squadron Bridge. Elected to serve on your bridge are: Executive Officer Joe W. Schady, Educational Officer John Meyenberg, Administrative Officer Bill Hayes, Secretary Pat Brown and Treasurer Rick Cone. With the exception of Rick Cone, all are new to the Bridge. Previously, at another squadron, I served as the Administrative Officer, Executive Officer and Commander. We will do our best to keep Charleston Sail and Power Squadron moving in the right direction at an appropriate speed.

This new Bridge was vetted by the Nominating Committee and elected by the squadron members. They are all well qualified, willing and able to serve. If you like what your Bridge Officers and/or Committees are doing tell them "Bravo Zulu". BRAVO ZULU is a naval signal meaning "Well Done". If you do not like our direction and speed please let me know.

You have all heard that you are responsible for your wake. By looking at a wake you can see what direction a vessel is heading and estimate its speed. Your Bridge is responsible for the wake of our squadron. There are two ways not to leave a wake: one is to remain on the beach (do nothing), the other is to go "Dead in the Water" (drift with the current). Charleston Sail and Power Squadron, with your assistance, hopes to make a good wake. One of the benches in the Atlanta Aquarium has this quote: "History is written by those who make the wake,

not by those who watch safely from the shore." Our Bridge needs you to help us make a good wake.

Our goals for 2010 are:

Increase membership by 12% - we need your help in encouraging boaters to take our American Boaters Course (ABC) and in recruiting 20% of the ABC graduates.

Education Department to conduct four ABC courses plus seminars - we need instructors and mentors. Talk to SEO John Meyenberg if you can help.

All members to achieve the Grade of Advance Piloting (AP) by taking Seamanship, Piloting and Advanced Piloting classes. I also encourage you to take Marine Electronics, which I teach.

Have one Dinner Meeting a quarter in a Charleston Area Restaurant with the rest in our Club House. Each Dinner Meeting should include an interesting speaker. Your attendance is encouraged. Administrative Officer Bill Hayes is responsible for Dinner Meetings and Guest Speakers and would appreciate your suggestions.

Mixture of monthly lunch, raft-up or overnight cruises to include two extended cruises: one North to Georgetown with an option to continue to Myrtle Beach and one South to Beaufort with an option to continue to Savannah. Boating Activities are part of the Administrative Department.

Improve our Club House. Your Capital Improvement suggestions are requested.

Executive Officer Joe Schady and the Housing Committee are responsible for maintaining and improving our Club House.

Don't watch safely from shore. Please become active in one or more of Charleston Sail and Power Squadron's activities. Help us make a good wake.
