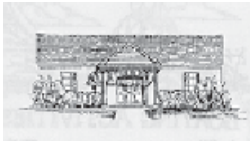

29 Feb 2008 - 2 Mar 2008



All vessels are requested to rendezvous at the Leland Marine in Jeremy Creek at McClellanville Friday afternoon or evening on 29 February 2008. Otherwise you may arrive Saturday morning before Noon. Departure for the Cape will occur at 1100 am, Saturday, 1 March, 2008 with the high tide at 1:28 pm. Any vessel needing assistance shall be promptly given high priority, and all passengers should be safely removed before any vessel sinks.

Adequate libations must be provided all crews and passengers, especially upon return to Jeremy Creek. Additionally, dinner will be held at “TW Grahams Store” at 1800. Cars must be provided for adequate transportation to the local cookery shop where all will enjoy dinner and sundry fun.

Remember, waters around the Cape are very shallow, so larger boats will anchor as waters become thin. Shallow-draft boats will ferry passengers to shore. Caution: There is no dock! So make sure you bring high boots to wade ashore. We have about one hour to explore, and then return to our boats before the falling tide catches us.

Charleston Boat Parade of Lights

Blue icicle lights were hung at the top of the life lines, six strands of colored lights were run up the mast and arranged as a Christmas tree, a star was placed forward on the jib, and a 300-light animated crystal elephant was placed on top of the bimini. Power was provided from a 2kW inverter. Power consumption was minimized by setting all lights to blinking. It was estimated that the power drain from the battery exceeded battery charging rate from the alternator. If you have a picture of the *Wind Elephant* during the parade, boat 11, the Porters would appreciate a digital copy."

Pledge of Allegiance: Cdr Art Clark

Lt/C B. J. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of the November Excom Meeting, and Lt/C Dick Howells seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the minutes for the November 2007, Excom Meeting were approved.

Officers' Reports:
