From the Commander Cdr David Walsh, AP



Now that my term as Squadron Commander is coming to a close, I decided to write about the upcoming squadron election and present a brief summary of the candidates for next year's Bridge Officers and their job responsibilities.

Art Clark is the nominee for Squadron Commander. Art served as our Executive Officer in 2007 and Administrative Officer in 2006. Art is an avid boater, retired navy officer, graduate of the US Naval Academy and corporate business consultant. He is a Vessel Safety Inspector and runs the Squadron's Visitor Program. Art's spouse Merle Clark is artistically talented and participates in many squadron activities. As you can see, the Clarks bring a lot of talent to the Commander's position.

The Squadron Executive Officer is responsible for external programs such as Boat Shows, Public Relations, Cooperative Charting and Vessel Safety Checks. Dick Howells is the nominee for Executive Officer. Dick served as this year's Administrative Officer. He is a retired business manager and very active squadron member. Dick tirelessly promotes the Charleston Power Squadron and has brought in several new members. He and his spouse Ann are mainstays at the squadron's meetings. They often provide their boat "Katie Ell" for squadron activities such as Cooperative Charting and training cruises. We are fortunate to have Dick Howells as our nominee for this important position.

Administrative Officer is one of the most demanding positions in the squadron. The Administrative Department is responsible for the internal operation of the squadron. This includes boating activities, monthly meetings, membership and member involvement. This year's nominee for Administrative Officer is BJ Smith. BJ is a relatively new member who has become the-person-to-go-to when the squadron needs to get something done. He served on the Housing Committee, organized several very success-

ful cruises and volunteered his boat "Daisy Belle" for many squadron boating activities. With BJ leading the Admin Department, you can count on 2007 being a year of action.

An active teaching program is an extremely important squadron function. Maintaining a high level of teaching activity, training new instructors, ordering books, recruiting students and supervising tests takes a lot of time. 


Election of Officers – 11 October 2007

The meeting was called to order by Cdr David Walsh at 1830, at the Headquarters Building. Those in attendance were Cdr David Walsh, P/D/C Bob Gissell, P/C Janice Kromer, Lt/C Art Clark, Lt/C Dick Howells, Lt/C Chuck Altschul, Lt/C Jim Bass, P/Lt/C Steve Kromer, Lt Wendy Walsh, Lt Steve Poe, Lt Gene Gilfillin, B. J. Smith, Gary Whitley, Carole Gilfillin, and Peggy Bass. A quorum was established.

P/Lt/C Steve Kromer led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Lt Steve Poe made a motion to approve the minutes of the July Excom Meeting and P/Lt/C Steve Kromer seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the minutes for the July Excom Meeting were approved.

Officers' Reports:

Executive: Per Lt/C Art Clark: Cooperative Charting Lt Steve Poe reported that two assignments have been completed and three members have committed to doing Cooperative Charting in the fall, but no firm dates have been established. Cdr David Walsh reported that Stf/C Horst Boetige volunteered come to Charleston to teach us how to properly do a depth survey for Cooperative Charting.

Educational: Cdr David Walsh reported that the fall 2007 training schedule has been posted on the web. Monday, 10 September 2007, the students will meet the instructors and pickup class materials that are available. The actual training classes will begin the week of 17 September.

Administrative: Per Lt/C Dick Howells: Lt/C Dick Howells reported that the August cruise is the Sandy Point Raft-up scheduled for 11 August 2007. The speaker for our member meeting on 9 August 2007, will be Pat Harris from the DNR. He will be presenting information about fish sampling off the coast from South Carolina to Florida.

P/C Janice Kromer reported that the shipmate program is doing very well.

Lt Wendy Walsh reported that we had 189 members at the beginning of the year and we currently have 174 members. Twenty nine members did not renew their memberships for various reasons.

Secretary: Per Lt/C Jim Bass: Lt Steve Poe reported that the web site is nearing the end of the allotted disk space and, as a consequence, he is having to delete some of the older information currently on the web.

Cdr David Walsh reported that Steve Brostoff has been working with the Jerry Kemerer to get up to speed in publishing the Palmetto Log. The deadline for getting articles published in the September Log is 15 August. A motion was made by Lt/C Art Clark to charge \$10.00 for personal advertisements in the Palmetto Log to be run one time. The motion was seconded by P/Lt/C Steve Kromer. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

Ship's Store: Lt/C Jim Bass reported that orders made by members at the last two membership meeting have come in and will be available at the August membership meeting.

Treasurer: Per Lt/C Chuck Altschul: Lt/C Chuck Altschul provided a Profit and Loss statement for the Squadron from December 2006, through July 2007. The total income for the period is \$18,793.95, and the total expense for the period is \$15,360.77. The net income for the period is \$3,433.18. Lt/C Chuck Altschul also provided the proposed operating budget for December 2007 through November 2008. Lt/C Chuck Altschul reported that we have \$9,991.00 in our checking account and \$9,100.00 in our money market fund for a total of \$19, 091.00. A motion was made by P/Lt/C Steve Kromer to present the proposed 2008 operating budget to the general membership at the October membership meeting. The motion was seconded by Lt/C Art Clark. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

Commander: Cdr David Walsh reported that the Fall Governing Board meeting will be in Norfolk, VA, 4-9 September 2007. For those interested in attending see the USPS web site for more information.

The District 26 Fall Conference and District Change of Watch will be in Hilton Head and is scheduled for 19-21 October 2007.

Charleston Power Squadron Change of Watch is scheduled for 10 November 2007, at the Storm Point Conference Center at the Naval Weapons Station. A motion was made by Lt/C Dick Howells to provide \$500.00 to hire Smokey Wiener and the Hot Links to provide music at the Change of Watch. The motion was seconded by Steve Kromer. After considerable discussion a vote was taken and the motion carried.

Bylaws: After considerable discussion regarding changes to Charleston Power Squadron Bylaws, P/C Janice Kromer made a motion to recommend the changes to the general membership. The motion was seconded by Lt/C Dick Howells. A vote was taken and the motion carried.


