#### **How Current Is Your Chart?**


Take a look in your chart table and look at the date on the charts that you are using. My guess is that many are two, three, five or maybe even years older. Do you religiously check the weekly Local Notice to Mariners to update your chart for changes in aides to navigation locations, extinguished lights, dredging spoil areas, etc.? Over the past several years NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) has continued to reinvent itself by improving its services to mariners. Just a few years ago paper charts, the only charts available, were updated on a very relaxed schedule. It has been NOAA's charge to make this happen weekly. In order to do this, new innovations in chart delivery and chart types had to be developed.

NOAA still produces and maintains nautical charts that cover the Great Lakes, the coastal waters of the U.S. and its territories. NOAA's chart arsenal still includes the traditional paper charts but now go far beyond by introducing electronic charts and other user-friendly products.


